Using the Animals poster

What to do

- 1. Show the Animals poster and introduce the topic. Refer back to the poster as you work through the topic. Add more information to the poster as students learn more words.
- 2. Find out what students already know about animals:
 - Do they know that, in science, animals include fish, birds and so on?
 - How many animals can they name already?
 - Can they tell you about where they live?
 - Can they describe them?
 - Can they put them in categories, for example, animals with four legs, animals that fly?
- 3. Use known vocabulary to talk about animals including:
 - parts of the body
 - colours
 - basic prepositions, for example, in the sea, on land, in the bush.
- 4. Begin to talk about the animals using simple scientific language, for example, appearance, habitat, reproduction, feeding, moving, backbone, warm or cold blood.
- 5. Share personal experiences with animals.
- 6. Photocopy the poster to:
 - cut up to make a jigsaw for students to put together collaboratively
 - use for a labelling activity make a word list students can use
 - use the labelled pictures for sorting activities.
