

Text Structure and Language Features: Examples 1 and 2

Text Structure - Polite enquiry requests

<b>Opening</b>	
Teacher:	Good morning Ahmed.
<b>Response</b>	
Student:	Good morning Ms/ Sir.
<b>Initiation</b>	
Teacher:	How are you?
<b>Response/ initiation</b>	
Student:	Fine thanks and you?
<b>Response</b>	
Teacher:	Very well thank you.
<b>Closing</b>	
Student:	Bye Ms/Sir.
<b>Response/closure</b>	
Teacher:	Bye Ahmed.

Language Features

Use of greetings, e.g. Good morning.

Use of proper nouns to identify people, e.g. Ahmed

Use of 'wh' questions, e.g. How are you?

Use of ellipsis typical of responses in casual conversations, e.g. Fine thanks. (not I'm fine thanks.)

Use of closures, e.g. Bye.

Text Structure - Demand for action

<b>Initiation</b>	
Teacher:	Open your books and write the date.
<b>Response</b>	(Non verbal; students respond, opening books, writing date.)

Language Features

Use of imperatives to initiate response, e.g. open, write
