Nouns:

Proper nouns e.g. Autumn
Common nouns e.g. leaves, ground, sadness

Prepositions:

Of place along, on, over etc., e.g. along the ground

Articles:

Definite the, e.g. the wind
Omission of articles
before most proper nouns,
with uncountable nouns e.g. in Autumn

Pronouns:

Subject I, you, we, they etc., e.g. You are down.
Possessive our, her, my, their etc., e.g. crunching under my feet

Conjunctions and connectives:

Additive and, also, as well etc., e.g. You are down and alone.

Question formation:

'wh' e.g. Why is the poem sad? What is the poem about?
Subject reversal e.g. Is it winter?
'do' support
when no auxiliary e.g. Do the leaves move along the ground?
Modal 'can' e.g. Can you imagine the trees.

Short answer forms:

e.g. Yes, she does. No, she doesn't. Yes, it has. No, it hasn't.
Yes, it is. No, it isn't.

Verbs:

Present tense verbs e.g. is
Participles used
as action verbs e.g. falling, moving, rustling, crunching

Punctuation:

e.g. apostrophes, question marks, upper/lower case, full stops,
commas, lines, verses, stanzas, chorus
