## **Suggested Teaching Components**

- Write using the text structure and language features of an information report
- Use appropriate vocabulary
- Write demonstrating some overall cohesion and coherence, e.g. cohesive paragraphs, opening and closing sentences, use of topic sentences
- Use appropriate tone, e.g. formal or informal
- Set out work in a fluent and legible style using appropriate layout
- Establish a close relationship between the text and accompanying pictures, diagrams, maps etc.
- Use the writing process to plan, draft, redraft

## **Suggested Themes, Topics and/or Experiences**

Local community, citizenship, civil rights, homeland, environment, digestion, countries, wars, religions, international relations, animals, people, technology, government, sport

# Suggested Assessment Tasks (May be linked to Unit and Achievement standards in ESOL, English and other curriculum areas)

• Write an information report

Note: Many of the teaching activities can also be used as assessments

## **Sample Strategies**

#### Teacher directed

- Build field knowledge through, e.g. field trip, visuals, matrix using topic headings
- Model/deconstruct information texts on the same theme
- Compare different text types, e.g. recount and information report to reinforce structure and language features
- Develop semantic map, taxonomy (structured overview) of ideas/concepts

#### Joint/guided

- Complete complex sentences using given clauses
- Write paragraphs using information from semantic maps, taxonomies etc.
- Use scaffold to write paragraphs from topic sentences
- Complete clozes on language features, e.g. adjectives, passive voice
- Supply a missing paragraph or text section with and without cues
- Use a writing frame to construct a report

## Independent

- Write an information report with/without scaffolding
- Create a brochure, e.g. health, entertainment with text and illustrations
- Design a text organiser to elicit information from an expert in a given field
- Write a glossary of topic-specific vocabulary
- Produce a voice-over for a brief documentary on topic seen but not heard
- Summarise an information report
- Reconstruct an information report from a summary
