

### 3.32 Target vocabulary – habitats

**Topic:** Plants  
**Subtopic:** Habitats  
**Activity type/skill:** Word list  
**Literacy focus:** Vocabulary

#### Objective

- Introduce target vocabulary.
- Experience spoken and written forms and their usage.

#### What you need

#### What to do

1. Play track 3.32 (Track 11 for this topic) and have students look at both pages of the student worksheet as they hear each word and its extensions (tense variations and plurals) and the word in a defining context.

2. Have students listen again and repeat the words.
3. Have students copy the words in the spaces.
4. Point out plurals (for example, 'They look like needles') and changed verb forms ('When something spreads, it moves outwards...').

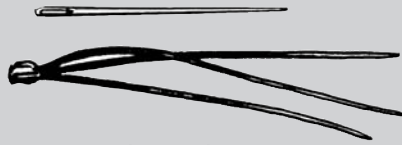

*preposition*

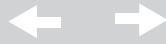
Leaves that grow \_\_\_\_\_ one another are on different sides of the stem, at the same height.



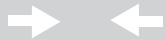
## outwards

## tough

*adjective*

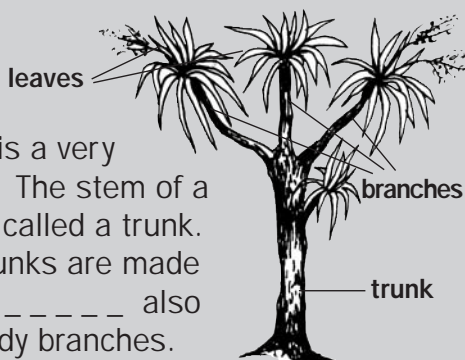

## tree
