# 3.41 Describing leaves

Topic: Plants Subtopic: Habitats Activity type/skill: Using adjectives Literacy focus: Speaking Genre: Descriptions

# Objective

- Introduce adjectives commonly used to describe leaves.
- Develop fluency using noun groups.

### What you need

Student worksheet (see next page)

#### What to do

- 1. Look at the student worksheet and talk about the leaves and words used to describe their shape, edges and arrangement. Add more words the students know.
- 2. Work together to make lists of familiar adjectives that can be used to describe the size and colour of leaves such as 'large', 'green', 'dark green'.
- 3. Talk about how descriptive phrases are formed. New learners of English often make mistakes in adjectival order, for example, 'a green long leaf'. Explain that the pattern is: article or number + adjective + noun. If there is more than one adjective, the order is usually: article or number + quality + colour + noun.
- 4. Working in pairs, have students point to leaves they drew in activity 3.40 for others to describe using more than one adjective.
- 5. Working in groups and using the students' drawings or real leaves, have one student describe a leaf, for example, 'This leaf is needle-shaped with smooth edges' and the other students must point to the leaf. Make it a game where the first student to correctly identify the leaf wins.
