Objective


Spelling target vocabulary.

What you need

• Student worksheet (see next page)

What to do

- 1. Have students look at the top of the student worksheet and explain how to play hangman:
 - Students work in a group or pairs.
 - Student A thinks of a word and writes down as many dashes as there are letters in the word.
 - Student B guesses what letters are in the word, and Student A writes each letter down.
 - Student A writes a correct guess on the appropriate dash. If a letter occurs more than once in the word, all letters must be written down.
 - If Student B names a letter that is not in the word, Student A starts to draw some gallows. The game continues until student B guesses the word or until the person on the gallows is hanged. The gallows are drawn like this:




2. Have students take turns to be the hangman.
