Topic: Animals Subtopic: Insects Activity type/skill: Cloze Literacy focus: Vocabulary

## Objective

• Use target vocabulary in a new and more demanding context.

#### What you need

- Student worksheet (see next page)
- Audio track 1.48

#### What to do

- 1. Look at the picture on the student worksheet and discuss what students know about wetā.
- 2. Play track 1.48 (Track 18 for this topic). Listen to the song 'Putaputawetā' and have them try to sing along. (The text of the song is in *School Journal*, Part 1, No 2, 1986.)
- 3. Have students listen to the interview and work alone to fill in the spaces in the cloze activity emphasise accuracy in spelling and word choice.
- 4. Discuss their answers.
