Coming to your school in term 4

Sixteen new Ready to Read books for guided reading, mostly at the Red and Yellow levels, and four big books for shared reading. These texts have a strong New Zealand flavour. They include humorous fantasy stories, two stories that explore aspects of the Christchurch earthquakes, and a moving account of a child's experience of an Anzac Day dawn parade. We hope you enjoy sharing this rich selection of books with your students.

Reviewing and improving the Ready to Read series

Ongoing review of Ready to Read ensures the effectiveness of the series in supporting the foundations of literacy for students in their early years at school.

New text levelling criteria

As outlined in the Ready to Read 50th Birthday flyer sent to schools in December 2013, new levelling criteria have been developed to ensure that the texts strongly support students in developing a self-extending reading processing system. All existing Ready to Read texts, including big books, have been reviewed against these criteria. For more information see: www.readytoread.tki.org.nz

As a result of the levelling review, some texts have been assigned to different levels on the colour wheel (for example, from Blue to Green) and some have been assigned to different sub-levels (for example, from Blue 3 to Blue 1). Six Ready to Read titles that have changed colour level were reprinted and sent to schools in early 2014 and as a result of a second – and final – phase of the review process, another three accompany this flyer.

As part of the ongoing review, the Ministry is undertaking research into the text-trialling process, the content and delivery of teacher support materials, and digital innovations. We'll keep you informed of outcomes from this research.


Changes in text levels

Big books and shared reading Some books that were available as both big books and small books for shared *and* guided reading have now been designated for shared reading only. These books have memorable language and literary content that is above the level that students can initially access by themselves. The big books will still be accompanied by small books for students to read independently once they are very familiar with the book through repeated shared readings.

Texts that have been designated as shared texts only


As current stock runs out, and these books (big and small versions) are reprinted, the colour wheel will be removed from the back cover to reflect that these are not texts for guided reading.

New Zealand Sign Language Reading Resource

This year to support New Zealand Sign Language (NZSL), the Ministry of Education collaborated with Deaf Aotearoa, to develop selected Ready to Read titles as e-books. These apps are targeted resources intended to support effective guided and shared reading instruction for NZSL users. They are available through the Ministry of Education store pages on iTunes (for Apple devices) or Google Play (for Android devices) and are free to download. If you wish to use these e-books with other students, please note that Ready to Read books for guided reading are designed to be used initially as unseen texts with careful teacher monitoring and support. Independent use of the apps by students is likely to be most effective *after* a guided reading lesson.
