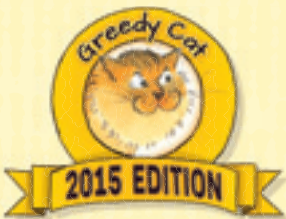

and the children gave him lunch.

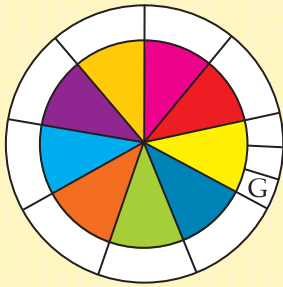


When the family came home,

"You are my cuddly Greedy Cat."



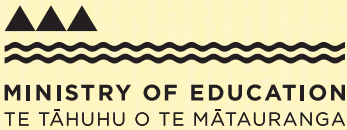
